DR. MARC STICKLE FAMILY GOES TO MISSION IN THE PHILIPPINES

It's been a long time since I sent any info in for your newsletter (like never-is that a long time?) Since many in our association know my situation and have been praying for our family I thought it would be relevant to let you know how God has been working.



First of all we are all (our family of four-Marc, Jill, Jamie, and Chet) headed to the Philippines March 15 on a mission trip. Our Academy here in Kelowna has a group of 53 going with The Quiet Hour and we will be doing a building project and medical clinics as well as helping. Ledy Melasharka with his series of magetings. There is a group of 10 from

helping Jody Melashenko with his series of meetings. There is a group of 19 from the dental school at LLU and I will be working with students and a local Philippino OD to provide an eyecare team—thanks to the help of Dennis Benedict.....

We have just returned from the Philippines where we were working with the Quiet Hour on a medical missions/evangelism trip and what an experience it was. Manila and the Philippines certainly do not have the modern level of conveniences we are used to and we are now more thankful for flush toilets, hot water, and safe food. We went with a group of over 35 students from our academy and joined

others from Blue Mountain Academy and else ware when we arrived. Before our week was over we had been exposed to menangitis, we were under a travel advisory from the US Embassy for terrorism/retaliation, and there was a 8.9 earthquake not far from where we were in Thailand.(Where we visited after we left the Philippines) Aside from those stresses we had a rewarding time. We saw over 800 patients in 4 days of exams and dispensed over 500 pairs of glasses. Apparently there is very little myopia in the Philippines--we saw maybe 50-60 patients with myopia. We were thankful Dennis Benedict had sent over 400+ pair of readers that we used for distance as well as near. We used between 12-15 students in our eyecare group and gave the kids a lot of responsibility which they love and thrived at. There are a number of budding Optometrists and Ophthalmologists in the group and they got a great experience learning to prescribe, fit glasses, and recognise cataracts, pinguecula, and pterygium. The worst case we saw was a 50 year old lady with a squamous cell carcinoma that had destroyed here lower lid and had no treatment. We were fortunate to have an Optometry student from the Philippines and a local Philippino Optometrist help us with finding referrals for a few of these cases. A number of you have been on these trips and understand the conditions and needs overseas and I

would highly recommend everyone do this (at least once) at some point in your career. We feel thankful and blessed to be home. "O Canada".

The picture is a little Philippino lady who got some glasses and was very pleased. The Philippino Optometrist that helped us had been living in Tacoma Park, Maryland the last 10 years and had just returned to the Philippines. He was building his house at the time, but was kind enough to help us with all of our clinics. He



did not have an email yet, but I will forward it as he promised to send his new address and email to me.

Once we return from the Philippines I will be headed off to Ontario to attend Queen's University, as I have been accepted into their MBA for Science and Technology. This is a very exciting opportunity and we have seen God's hand in this decision. It will be a difficult year-as I am going to try to commute (when possible) and Jill and the kid's will be staying in Kelowna. Jamie and Chet will be in grades 11 and 9 next year and are very involved and in a very good school, so we did not want to move them at this time. The Queen's program is specifically for leadership and management in the high tech science and medical fields and was ranked by Business Week in the fall of 2004 as the best program in the world for business schools outside of the US. We are very thankful that God is leading and opening doors, and hopefully are learning to faithfully follow. It is always

interesting to see what He has in store for us.

Thank you all so much for your prayers. We will miss you at convention this year, but will send my parents in our place.
