Women's Ministries has literacy projects in SUD (India), SDA (South America) and all the African Divisions (WAD, ECD,

I said the ASDAO would like to start out by supplying the Women's Ministries in India a 1000 pair of reading glasses for those who need them. From Hepzibah Kore, Women's ministries Director - India, says "I thank God for you and your association and your willingness to provide 1000 reading glasses for the women in our adult literacy classes. Those who requested for the reading glasses will consider this an answer to their prayers. What an opportunity to serve. What an opportunity for Optometry to be seen in a positive light by leaders of our world movement. There are many projects like this. For example, Paul R. Clee, Director of Health & Personal ministries, Trans-European Division, could use reading glasses as an opportunity to reach the Muslim world in his division.
