Thursday, was time spent visiting the Field Museum. Registration for those who were there and those who arrived that day. Fellowship together is


one of the great things of the convention.

VISION TEAM 2020

Mission Accomplished! The "Vision Team 2020" along with physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists and other allied health care professionals recently returned from our annual Medical Mission trip. Our destination: Saint Catherine,



Jamaica. This year's travel marks the 5th anniversary that the "Vision Team 2020" has partnered with United Hands, Inc. (non-profit organization based in Ocala, Florida) in providing free vision screening to countries with minimal access to health care. We also had Dr. Daniels, Director of "Vision Team 2020", extend her stay for an additional 5 days to volunteer with "New Steps Health Expo", another community wide screening program. We dispensed over 1300 pairs of prescription glasses and depleted our entire inventory (600 pairs) of UV-400 protective sunglasses! Only prayers made it possible for us to have enough supplies to last for the entire time.

Custom printed brochures were given to help educate when eye conditions were diagnosed. Several people had undiag-

nosed Glaucoma, visually impairing Cataracts and most adults suffered from Dry Eves and Pterygiums as a result of the intense sun and heat in Jamaica. Virtually everybody could benefit from the bottles of artificial tears.
